AMANDA: Hello?

DOROTY: Hello, Amanda!

Amanda: Hi, how are you?

Doroty: Well, and you?

Amanda: I'm good. I spoke to a lady, it was her, really, who called me, who works in the Mayor's office in Perugia and she asked me if there's something, anything, which I would need and I told her: "Well, my mother is arriving and she doesn't have a place to stay, is there something you can do about it?" and they: "Yes, of course, we can give you this apartment and we can pick you up from the train station when your mom gets here tomorrow", and I: "Oh, alright!". Doroty: Oh!

Amanda: So, yes... Yes, seeing myself on-line made me feel strange, I could remember exactly what I was doing there...

Doroty: Eh, eh, eh! They have found... Did you read anything else about it now?

Amanda: Yes, it's interesting because the information about what is happening is becoming more precise, but it doesn't mention suspects or anything else. I know a little more about it compare to the newspapers, but... Oh, I have also had some on-line requests from some magazines, that is they sent me some emails via Facebook and... I told them I couldn't talk, but what they wanted was to talk... only to make the people aware so they don't feel bad and I said: "I can't tell you anything until this matter is closed but if you're interested in having an interview I can do that". and they: "Yes, yes, yes, call us when this all thing is over" and I'm sure they'll contact me again via e-mail, but... Doroty: Yes, go to Google News and then click on UK below.

Amanda: Ok.

Doroty: And there you'll find all the British newspapers.

Doroty: Ohhhh!

Amanda: There.

Doroty: How nice!

Amanda: Yes, it's true.

Doroty: Good.

Amanda: Yes.

Doroty: So, your intention is still to go to China?

Amanda: Yes, certainly.

Doroty: Ok. I wasn't going to bother you with this.

Amanda: And I told myself: "To hell!", but anyway today it's much better and people are very kind, and I can't wait for my mom's arrival tomorrow, it's a great thing for me.

Doroty: Yes.

Amanda: I'm super enthusiastic (happy) about this, and Raffaele wants to meet my mom, he's very curious.

Doroty: How nice!

Amanda: Eh?

Doroty: Good.

Amanda: Yes, is very enthusiastic.

Doroty: I'm very happy you are feeling better now.

Amanda: Yes, I feel better, and since this whole story is anything but over, I will for sure be back at the Police Station sooner or later, I'm sure, but I didn't have to go today, therefore today was a beautiful day, you know...

Doroty: Good. Very good.

Amanda: Indeed.

Doroty: Then, I will call you tomorrow when your mom is there?

Amanda: Yes, of course. How are you (plural)?

Doroty: Good. Last night I was frightened.

Amanda: Frightened?

Doroty: Because it's all so near, you know? One hears such things, but they are very far and now you're involved and it's so close.

Amanda: Indeed.

Doroty: It's really strange. Last night, I was aghast, I never would have thought that. And I told Oma (sic) and she immediately locked the door with the key.
