Subject: summary of a witness statement by a person informed of the facts, by MARZAN, Marco, personal details recorded previously.

On November 3, at 18:40, in the offices of the Mobile Squad of the Questura of Perugia. Before the undersigned officials of the Prosecutor-General's office: Assistant Deputy Chief Domenico Giacinto Profazio, Assistant Deputy Chief GIOBBI, Edgardo, Deputy Commissioner Monica NAPOLEONI, and Chief Inspectors Antonio FACCHINI and Rita FICARRA, the person named in the subject line is present, who declares as follows, in addition to the declarations made yesterday, November 2, concerning facts under investigation:

Responds when questioned (A). Stefano is not a tidy person normally, although he is clean as far as personal hygiene and clothes are concerned.

He does not always make his bed; also, he sometimes eats there and studies on the bed.

I have seen Stefano smoke marijuana in the house. I do not know if he may have tried other, more powerful drugs. I believe that the article about the person who invented [it,] the article about LSD was only in Stefano's room as an image, for an aesthetic purpose.

A. Riccardo never spoke to me of the problem of resin leaking from the ceiling. Riccardo is a tidy type, but not excessively.

A. The "living" hall was mostly used by Riccardo, but also by all of us; Stefano and Riccardo have told me they have stretched a rope in the hall to hang laundry.

A. The small bathroom was normally used - including as a place to keep the cat's litter box and the bowl for its food - by all of us, excluding Riccardo, who used it occasionally, preferring the other bathroom. However we all used it for shaving.

A. I kept the keys from my house inside the apartment; I kept them on a metal ring.

A. I don't quite remember if I have ever handed the house keys to my friend Giorgio in the past, but definitely not recently.

A. My friend Giorgio, whose last name is Cocciaretto, studies in Perugia at the University and lives alone in a studio here on Via Fabbretti, of which I do not know the house number.

A. When I was leaving, there was no blood on the floor in the house; on the walls, perhaps there were small spots caused by insects.

A. Last Saturday night, the striped cat defecated on the sofa in the hall so I took off the cover. I remember that I shook it and placed it outside but I don't remember washing it.

A. The black cat actually has an injured ear but I am not aware that it has dripped blood.

A. My cousin usually uses blue bedsheets.

A. As a rule, the cat likes to sleep on the bed, mostly Stefano's, so I reckon it was the cat that pulled the cover and slept there on the floor.

A. I am astonished by the fact you have told me, that there is a lot of blood on Stefano's bed.

A. I have never seen any stain of blood on the light switch in the hall.

A. The stone you have found in the house is perhaps the same as [or like] those near the shed [lit. pigsty].

A. I have never seen blood in the sink in the kitchen.

A. I know that the girls did not open the door if they did not know the person.

A. I never made advances of any kind to Meredith.

A. I confirm that Meredith did come to our residence; I believe they made love in Giacomo's room at least once.

A. Sometimes Giacomo would recount his sexual experiences with Meredith to me; in particular, he told me that he also performed oral and anal sexual acts with her.

A. I have nothing else to add.

The Office acknowledges that, on behalf of a competent judicial authority, the witness is required to observe secrecy in order not to prejudice the inquiry in progress.
